

WESTERN ONTARIO.

BRANT.

Mr. Dawson, sen., who drove over the river bank at Onondaga into the river Saturday evening, is recovering from the bruises he received in the frightful fall. All those injured through the bus accident at Brantford are getting around nicely. Those who have felt the shock most severely are Miss Forman and Mr. James. They are, however, making rapid progress towards recovery. The damage to the rig and harness will amount close upon \$400, for which a claim will be lodged against the township council by Messrs. Hunt & Colter.

On Wednesday T. S. Mearns, barrister, of Toronto, was married to Miss Anna Angus, of Paris. The marriage ceremony was performed at the residence of the bride's uncle, George R. Angus, Paris, by Rev. J. A. Hardie, Ayr. The bridesmaid was Miss Jessie Angus, sister of the bride, and F. W. Casey, barrister, of Toronto, supported the groom.

BRUCE.

The Presbyterian congregation in Ashfield have called Rev. John Rose, of Whytecombe, Cape Breton.

A horse belonging to Allan McLeod dropped into a well at Lucknow on Friday, and had to be removed by the aid of a windlass. The animal is very little the worse of the accident.

ESSEX.

Geo. K. Prowse & Son, of Windsor, have sold the Rattray property, on Chatham street for \$1,200, and the Kay house on Crawford avenue for \$1,200.

A. H. Lidwell, reeve of Pelee Island, having died, nomination for a new election was held on Friday, and W. Mickle and J. Brown were nominated.

Inspector of Licenses Elliot, of Windsor, died Saturday morning after an illness extending over many months. He was born in Amherstburg in 1827, and in the rebellion sustained an accident that made him a cripple for life. He taught school for many years and then entered the mercantile trade in Kingsville and Colchester. After this he went into the mill business, and in 1872 he was made inspector of licenses for Essex. Two years ago his illness became so severe that he could not attend to his duties and the Government appointed Deputy Castaner. He was married twice and leaves a widow and three children. He was greatly respected.

ELGIN.

Charles Marshall, a brakeman in the employ of the Michigan Central Railroad, fell off a box car on to a flat car the other night and broke his arm in two places. He was taken to St. Thomas.

George Young, of Southwold, was arrested by Chief Fevings, St. Thomas, on the charge of fraud. Young had got goods to the amount of \$7.60 from Mr. Birbridge's harness shop by representing himself to be John Carmichael. The case was dismissed on Young paying the account and the costs in the case.

A long-suffering petition was sent to the Minister of Justice some time ago, praying that a young boy named Frank Sharkey, sentenced to five years in Penitentiary for burglary committed in St. Thomas about two years ago, be released. Word has been received in that city that the petitioners' request would be granted.

C. Joiner, of Southwold, who was brought into the celebrated Melbourne horse case, by the purchase of a team of horses for W. J. Evans, which are claimed to be part of the late Alex. Dunn's, has been tried at Melbourne. No evidence was taken and the charge against Mr. Joiner was dismissed. Mr. Joiner has instituted a civil suit for damages for false and malicious arrest.

William and John Penhale, Yarmouth, have taken to St. Thomas the largest load of wool ever brought into that city, the weight being 1,029 pounds. They sold it to E. Shephard.

The St. Thomas customs collections for June amounted to \$4,974.88.

LAMBTON.

T. Jackson, ex-policeman, Petrolia, while taking a prisoner downstairs to the cells, which are in the basement, fell from on his face on the hard water-lime floor, owing to the prisoner making a sudden jump. Mr. Jackson was knocked senseless and had his face and head severely cut and bruised.

The death of Mrs. M. M. Glashan, collector of inland revenue for Sarnia district, who died at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. John Mackenzie, Christina street, Sarnia. Deceased was the daughter of Mr. Mayne, who was born in Ballyvaughan, county Tyrone, Ireland, Aug. 30, 1817, and was therefore in his 75th year. She came to London, Ont., in June, 1833, in company with her grandfather, George Bell, of Gorrie Hill, county Tyrone. Mr. Bell was one of the first of country settlers on the St. Clair River. Mr. Bell, with his grandson, Geo. Johnson, of Moore, drove to Windsor with an ox team, thence by steamer to St. Clair, where he purchased land the day after he arrived. Mrs. McGlashan was scarcely 16 years old when she came to St. Clair. At the age of 21 she married the late Peter McGlashan, whom she survived twelve years. She leaves two daughters, Mrs. John Mackenzie and Miss McGlashan, and two sons, Colin and Alexander, and a goodly number of grandchildren.

OXFORD.

A petition is being circulated in Ingersoll to retain the second policeman.

Mrs. Wm. Badden, one of the earliest settlers in East Zorra, died Friday at the advanced age of 85 years and 8 months. Deceased met with an accident about three months ago from which she never fully recovered. Mrs. Badden came to Canada in 1834 and settled in East Zorra in 1840. She was one of the early settlers. She leaves a grown-up family of five sons and a daughter. Mr. Badden died 21 years ago.

A short time ago the brothers and sisters of Israel Day met at his residence on corner East Nissouri, and presented him with a handsome plush chair. Mr. Day received a fall about six months ago, resulting in the fracture of his leg about the knee, and has been unable to be around since. To say he was agreeably surprised at receiving such a handsome present as a token of their sympathy for their revered brother is scarcely expressive of the appreciation on his part. Mr. Day has the tenderest sympathy of the community in his severe affliction, and it is to be hoped that he may soon be able to again mingle with his numerous friends.

The Christian Endeavor Mission of the county of Perth held its annual meeting on July 1 in the grove at Avonbank. Rev. Mr. Hamilton, of Motherwell, presided, and Miss Mowat, of Stratford, acted as secretary. The reports presented by the various societies showed increase and progress in nearly every instance. Dr. Dickson, of Galt, gave an address on "Pledge Requirements" and Prayer Meeting Rules, which was listened to with great interest. There were between 400

and 500 persons present and the general hospitality of the Avonbank society was well taxed, but proved equal to the occasion. The next meeting is to be at Milverton.

—Concerning the class of trees it is better to plant, there is nothing better than the Norway spruce and the Canadian plane. The first are generally bought from nurseries, the last are best procured from swamps, as by that means they get the best roots. It is necessary here to use great care to keep them moist and covered from the time of drawing to that of planting.

The reason for this is that while the sap is not in an evergreen, the sap in the wood changes to a hard resinous substance which destroys all chance of growth.

The next time you see a tree waving in the wind, recollect that it is the tail of a great underground, many-armed, polypus-like creature, which is as powerful as you, and especially in summer time, as a peacock of his gorgeous expanse of plumage.

—Oats have much narrower leaves than barley when the blade first appears above the surface. This is mainly because there is less substance in the seed, that being what furnishes material for the leaf at first. But oats sown after the soil has been warmed, come up with broader leaf than that sown early while air and soil are cold. Sometimes rolling those early sown peas will induce new and more vigorous growth, the second leaves starting up from the root being broader and stronger than the first.
