A keeper of swine should not fail to grow an acre or so of field peas for them. They make excellent food for giving hee young pigs a solid growth, without too much of a tendency to fat.

Oats have much narrower leaves than barley when the blade first appears above the surface. This is mainly because there is less substance in the seed, that being what furnishes material for the leaf at first. But oats sown after the soil has been warmed, come up with broader leaf than that sown early while air and soil are cold. Sometimes rolling those early sown pieces will induce new and more vigorous growth, the second leaves starting up from the rost being broader and stronger than the first.
