Anthracite Coal Strike Commission Gets Down to Work.

President Baer Declines to Recognize the Mine Workers As a Union.

Mr. Mitchell Presents the Demands That Preceded the Deadlock.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 27.—The anthracite coal strike commission today, in the hearing room of the Interstate Commerce commission, held its first conference with the parties to the controversy in the anthracite regions. There was a full representation of both operators and miners and members of the press and other interested parties were present. The commission occupied the elevated seats and the operators and members of the press and other interested parties were present. The proceedings covered about two hours, and were given up entirely to a discussion of the demands of the operators and the proposed investigation. The commission decided to begin work next Monday morning at 9 o'clock, the first day of the investigation to be devoted to an examination of the mines and conditions in the anthracite region in the vicinity of Scranton. The entire anthracite field will be covered. There was considerable discussion over a proposition made by the commission to have expert accountants appointed to audit statements of wages and classifying of miners to make the anthracite work of the commission, but no results were reached on this point, beyond the announcement by the commission that the commission's intention to appoint such an accountant in case his services should be necessary.

During the course of the meeting, Mr. Mitchell, as the representative of the miners, presented a copy of the original declaration of the miners as formulated by the Shamokin convention as the basis of demands of the miners. This demand is, first, for an increase of 20 per cent. in the price of coal mined by weight at a minimum rate of 90 cents per ton of 2,240 pounds; fourth, a wage agreement between the operators and the miners for adjustment of wages. Mr. Baer, on the part of the coal operators took exception to Mr. Mitchell's copy of the demands of the miners, and said that the commission as a representative of the mine workers' union, but said that he had no objection to his presence as a representative of the strikers as such in their individual capacity.

The commission made no attempt to settle the controversy, but was apparent that the recognition of the miners union would be an important and knotty problem for the arbitrators.

Washington, Oct. 27.—The anthracite coal strike commission met at 2 o'clock this afternoon in the hearing room of the Interstate Commerce commission. All the members of the commission were present, occupying seats upon the bench. President Mitchell, of the United Mine Workers, and District President Bailey appeared for the miners. For the coal carrying roads were represented by President Baer, of the Philadelphia & Reading; E. B. Thompson, of the Lehigh Valley; J. H. Truesdale, president of the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western; David Wilcox, vice-president of the Scranton Coal company, and the Elk Mill Coal & Iron company. J. B. Torrey, attorney for the Lehigh Valley company.

Judge Gray, president of the commission, read the order of the day, creating the commission, and in a general way outlined the procedure to be followed in the presentation of the case. He said that in accordance with the memorial practice among English-speaking people, the case would first receive the statements or demands of the miners, who were to be regarded, for the purposes of this case, as the prosecutors. The reply of the coal operators could then be heard, Judge Gray said, in order that the commission might have before it a definite issue.

At the conclusion of Judge Gray's remarks President Mitchell said that he had with him the formal demands made by the miners and the operators, and the suggestion of Judge Gray be read the demands adopted by the Shamokin convention, the rejection of which resulted in the strike.

Walter Edward Weyl was also present as a representative of the miners. The hearing room was crowded with the people interested in the case, and with spectators. President Baer objected to the presence of Mr. Mitchell as a representative of the United Mine Workers of America, but said he had no objection to Mitchell's appearance as a representative of the anthracite coal miners generally.

Mr. Mitchell's objection was to avoid the recognition of the Mine Workers Union as an operator.

Mr. Mitchell replied that the objection as to his status was not involved in the case. He said that he appeared as a representative of the anthracite coal miners, and distinctly refrained in his reply from mentioning the union. President Baer and Thomas suggested that the commission proceed at once to the coal fields in order that it might be informed at the outset as to the conditions there. It was agreed that Mr. Mitchell should file with the commission next Monday a detailed statement of the claims of the miners. The statement he read today was a preliminary statement of the case. The representatives of the operators announced that they would file an answer to this statement of Mr. Mitchell on Monday within three days of that time.

It was suggested that each side to the controversy appoint an expert to go through the books of the coal companies to secure data upon which to work. But President Baer and other representatives of the companies immediately objected, and suggested that the case be decided on the basis of the facts as they were presented by the miners' representatives.

This question precipitated a long discussion, in which the coal operators and the miners' representatives were not compromised by the letter he had written. Judge Gray suggested that they could be represented. At the meeting which of the companies could be taken up first, and the place of the meeting could be determined by the coal company. Mr. Mitchell said that the cause of each coal company would be determined by the coal company. He would contend for the sliding scale on the regulation of wages. He said that he would not permit of that profit-sharing plan, which gave us peace formerly in our relation to our employees. Mr. Thomas, of the Hillside Iron and Coal, and the Pennsylvania Coal company, said he noticed the word "arbitra-

tion" had been applied to the commission's work, while he wanted it considered as an investigation. Judge Gray said that the President's instructions settled that it was an arbitration. Mr. Thomas also urged that the conditions in each of the mining companies were different, and could only be considered separately, he thought more progress could be made by an examination of the coal region. He thought many of the interests involved by the controversy were represented in New York, some of the hearings should be held in that city. The suggestion that sides appoint experts to examine the books of the companies was rejected by Judge Gray, the chairman of the commission.

Mr. Baer, after expressing his disinclination to accept this suggestion said that his company would submit their payrolls under oath of their accountant. President Mitchell said that he would facilitate the work of the commission if it would accept his statement on those issues that affect all the companies, and the mine workers' representatives in the anthracite region. Mr. Truesdale said that his company had a plan by which it was possible to speedily settle differences between his company and the mine workers. He proposed to appoint a commission to meet a commission of his company and the mine workers' representatives, and if there were any such that could not be settled, those issues should be referred to the commission for final arbitration.

The commission adjourned to meet in Scranton next Thursday morning. Before adjourning it was agreed that the operators shall submit sworn statements as to their payrolls, and that Mr. Mitchell should have access to the payrolls, and that Mr. Mitchell should verify them through the miners. If discrepancies are found it was agreed that the commission shall appoint an auditor, whose findings shall govern the commission.

While the commission was in session the mine operators proposed to place a sign on the anthracite coal strike commission, if it was decided to visit the mines. After the adjournment the commission adjourned to meet in Scranton next Thursday morning.
