

With the Trust Funds now in hand, together with the sum set aside in the Budget, to be raised by public subscription this week. it should be possible to establish an endowment, the income from which will be sufficient to provide these dependents with a pension equal to that granted to the dependents of Naval men killed on active service.

As many of these dependents are young children, the endowment must continue for a number of years, until the children become self-supporting.
