## Goorl Sarieties to Look for

H3' JOH: PEL.Tz.
I will try in this little article to relate and tell of some minor varieties :n stamps which every berinner or junior collector should make it a point to search for, as it often happens that careless parties or those who despise these varieties will sell or trade you some of these for a very low price, and you should be on the lookent for them. if yood plan to follow is ts search through all your duplicates for these little differences in stamps, which are always worth something.
Beginning with U.S. we will take up the capped two's, issue 3890. Two varieties are very common but the cap " 2 " on right figure is very rare. I hatwe found two copies of these among a lot of common U.S. stamps given me as a gift, Scott's catalogue lists all of these but does not price the right cap on " 2 " variety which seems to me to indicate its extreme scarcity: Then there are those Belguim errors, which mostly exist in the newspaper stamps. These are rather scarce, but you can sicmetimes find one or two copies amons a lot of continental stanıps. At least that has been my experience, or luck, for I have the $\mathbf{j c}$. green with Belgique misspelled "Beigique." This is a fine copy.

There is Denmark. In 1883 the 10 ore carmine appeared with the figures in corners of stamps very small. This variety unused is worth $\$ 4 . c 0$, used $\$ 2.00$. In 1885 the figures in corners were made a great deal larger, but these are very common.
The above variet,ss are all worthy of collecting and every beginner should do so.
