




SABBATH SCHOOL REGISTERS

AND RECORDS, PREPARED DA THE

Sabbath School Committee of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

The Committee, recognizing the importance of the facts that while there are about 1,000 places at which the grapel is regularly preached last year, by free, byterian ministers in Canada, there were reporte from only 277 Sabbath Schools, and of that number only 425 are reported as baring contributed anything to the missionary schemes of the Church, have re cently given much attention to thematter of recording and reporting the work done in the Kabbath Schools. The average contribution from all the children of the Churchduring last year was only 16 cents. Three facts show that a great deal has yet to be done to bring our Sabbath School system into a thorough condition of efficiency. To attain this end, the As-sembly's Committee has prepared a series of Records and Reports which are recommended for use by Sabbath Schools and Freshyteries, the adoption of which, it is toped, will be preductive of good results. The tolowing is a description of them, with the prices for which they may be obtained .-

1 "The Subbath School Class Register," for use by the Teacher, containing recording columns for a whole year. The names and addresses of the children require to be written only once during the year. Price, 15 cents.

S. "The Subbath School Record," for use by the Superintendent or Secretary. This Record, to be filled up each Sablath from the Teachers' "Class Register," has columns to correspond with those of the "Class Register," in which a permanent record is kest of the Releval Attendance, Recitation, Church Attendance and Contributions of all classes. And from this "Record" the Quarterly and Annual Repurtieure to be filled up. Trice, for a book to last one year, in paper covers, 35 cents; quarter bound, W centa

3, "The Quarterly and Annual Sabbath School Sammary and Report," to be filled up from the preceding at the end of the quarter and the year. This will show, et a glance, the statistics and results of each quarter and the whole year. Committee of the Presbytery in which the School is situated. The work of reporting, by the adoption of this system, will go on during the whole year, and the Presbytery's Convener thus be in constant communication with all the Schools. 
