The saw mill of William Shea at Royston, Ont., was destroyed by fire on September 12th, at a loss of \$2,500.

The sheriff is said to be in possession of the estate of James Harrison, lumber merchant, Burlington, Ont., who disappeared recently. The claims of creditors aggregate \$4,300.

CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The lumber market shows considerable snap. There has not been a perceptible increase in the demand, but the steady buying of small lots indicates that consumers are carrying comparatively light stocks and that they consider it wise to gradually increase their holdings. When the buying for fall and winter trade shall become more general increased activity will be seen. The harvest throughout the province has been safely garnered and the yield is quite up to the average. Business conditions generally are good and payments are being well met.

The hardwood manufacturers still continue to hold the reins of power. Competition among buyers is keen, and the bulk of the hardwood production has passed out of first hands. Prices rule very firm. Manufacturers are asking \$20 for ash, basswood and soft elm log run, mill culls out, \$18 for birch, and \$16 for maple. These prices are f.o.b. cars at the mill, and it is understood that large sales have been made near these figures. The present outlook is for a continuation of strength.

The call for lath is growing and that article promises to be quite brisk before winter. There are also more enquiries for white pine shingles.

It is yet too early to estimate the extent of operations in the woods during the coming winter. By some it is predicted that there will be a considerable shortage as compared with last season on account of the excessive cost of logging. No doubt the holders of timber limits acquired under the smaller stumpage charge will be opposed to depleting them unless a fair profit from the operations should seem reasonably certain.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

An enlargement in the demand for wide spruce lumber is perhaps the only change in the eastern market. The demand for all kinds of spruce is sufficient to absorb all the stock that is pressed for sale, so that prices continue frm. The large manufacturers have fixed a price on their stock and will doubtless hold it until the buyer meets the figure. There has been an increase in the transactions in cedar shingles, but these have not brought about a higher range of prices. Extras are selling at \$3.40 for Boston delivery. Considerable shipments of lath have been made to the New York market.

UNITED STATES.

Lumber is not being purchased in large quantities. Until the corn crop is fully
