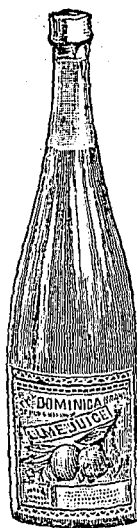

This week a thorough sifting of evidence from all parties—though secrecy is still maintained—goes to show that \$8.50 is the price for good short length green white pine piece stuff, and that \$8.75 is sometimes obtained for an extra good percentage of long lengths with some pickings in it. But, if a cargo has a large proportion of Norway in it, or is at all of the sawn order, it goes for \$8.25, and even as low as \$8. It is probable that within a week, under the influence of limited arrivals, a little better feeling in the yards, and the nearness of the fall trade, a trifle firmer feeling may prevail on choice dimension. For the sake of covering this probability, we place our upper figure in the range of \$8.75, making dimension stand at \$8.25 to \$8.75, with some very coarse, mixed and sawn stuff selling lower than \$8.25. It must also be understood that there is but very little difference this season between

Boston advices report a firmer feeling in India rubber, and the sales reported by us last week at 50c for fine Para would not be repeated, sellers now holding for 51c and 52c. Lower prices are not expected, in view of the high cost of much of the fine Para held in the American market, especially as it is in strong hands. The following were the cash prices in Boston last week:—Fine Para 50 to 52c; coarse 37; Nicaragua scrap 36, and sheet 36c. Esmeralda sausage 38 to 39; pressed Guayaquil 32; Panama 33c; Carthagena strip 30c; African thimble 39 to 40c; do small ball, 32; do large ball, 30; genuine Congo ball, 36; flake, 30c; Assam at 42c; black Madagascar at 35c, and mixed at 38c; Borneo, 30c; Mozambique, 38c
