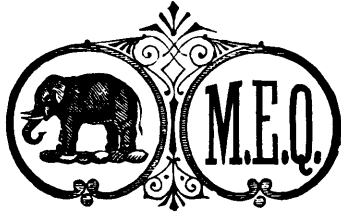

Mercantile Summary.

A CARLOAD of roller skates has been consigned by a Chicago firm to Yokohama.

NEW BRUNSWICK has voted \$20,000 for the importation of thoroughbred stock and a like amount for departmental buildings at Fredericton.

ALUMINUM for dental purposes is pronounced better than rubber and less in cost than gold. It is bright, strong, odorless, and as healthy to the gums as gold or platinum.

A BANKER in a Western town wishing, in one instance, to combine brevity with economy, accomplished it in this way. "Notice: Interest allowed, but no smoking."

J. D. CAMPBELL, of Kingsville, having purchased a stock of general dry goods in Berlin, will remove the same to Harrow, Ont., and commence business at once.

R. ROGERS, stationer, Owen Sound; R. Clargo, general trader, Pine River; E. Latimer, shoes, Seaforth; J. F. Freemantle, gunsmith, Stratford; and Jas. Slater, shoes, Toronto, are amongst the minor assignments recorded during the week.

An eastern exchange learns that the Crossen car works, now at Cobourg, are to be moved during the summer to Lindsay, the latter town having offered substantial inducements to secure the location at that point of this important industry.

THE suspension of Messrs. Germain & Frere, tanners, Quebec, lately noted, implicated a number of other concerns to a greater or lesser degree, and the following failures in the trade are connected, more or less directly, with that event. J. V. Dugal, tanner, Quebec, has suspended, with liabilities of \$10,000; also E. Cloutier, leather, Quebec, owing \$9,000; P. Michaud & Co., tanners, Lachrevotiere, liabilities \$17,000; J. Emond, Hedleville, and N. Turgeon, Levis, in same line, have also failed.
