Warren and account—Warren's Commission for Inquiry—

Warren Commission—Action for the plaintiff for damages for

damages received by coming into contact with a certain ray

of radiation in defendant's employment, whereby he lost the

use of his left hand and arm, which injuries he alleged were

caused by defendant's negligence. The learned Chief Justice

held that the plaintiff had amply failed to establish every

material fact which it was necessary for him to prove in order to

obtain the relief he sought, and dismissed the action with costs.

The action is brought against the defendant, who is a

corporation, and the plaintiff, who is an individual, seeks

damages for the loss of his left hand and arm, which he

alleges were caused by the negligence of the defendant.

The plaintiff claims that he was employed by the defendant

as a welder, and that while so employed he was exposed to

radiation from a certain ray, which he alleges caused him

to lose the use of his left hand and arm. He seeks

damages for the loss of his hand and arm, and for the

expenses incurred by him in connection with his injury.

The defendant denies that it was negligent, and that the
