- d) expedite, as possible, the appointment of new air routes to transportation companies as established in the bilateral Air Transport Agreement signed by both countries.
- The Parties, subject to the provisions of their respective legislation, shall take steps to eliminate obstacles to the tourism-related activities of travel agents, wholesalers, excursion operators, hotel chains, airlines, and bus and ship companies.
- 4. The Parties shall lay the foundations for on-going co-operation in planning, research, and the development of the tourism infrastructure.

ARTICLE II

Facilitation and Documentation

- The Parties shall facilitate tourist exchanges between the two countries by simplifying or eliminating, as appropriate, procedural and documentation requirements.
- 2. Each Party shall facilitate the import and export of non-commercial documentation and materials for the purpose of promoting tourism, subject to their respective legislation.
- 3. The Parties shall encourage the training of personnel at ports of entry in their respective countries in order that visitors may receive proper and courteous treatment.
