#### ANNUAL PHARMACEUTICAL SALES

##### Question No. 317—Mr. Herbert:

What is the latest estimate of the annual dollar volume of sales of pharmaceuticals in Canada?

**Hon. J.-J. Blais (Minister of Supply and Services):** Statistics Canada reports: current estimates of retail sales are made by type of store rather than by commodity. Sales for pharmacies, patent medicine and cosmetics stores include many commodities other than pharmaceuticals. Also, pharmaceuticals are sold through other types of stores as well as through outlets which are not retail locations. For these reasons, the question cannot be answered as asked. However, the following information is provided:

- (1) Sales of pharmacies, patent medicine and cosmetics stores—1979—\$2,398,008,000.
- (2) Sales of toileteries, cosmetics and drugs through department stores—1979—\$404,454,000.
