

## NOTICES OF MOTIONS.

*Mr. Caron*—On Friday next—BILL intituled: "An Act further to amend the Acts therein mentioned respecting the Militia and Defence of the Dominion of Canada."

*Mr. White* (Renfrew)—On Friday next—ENQUIRY OF MINISTRY—Is it the intention of the Government to place a postal car on the Western Extension of the Canada Central Railway; and if so, when?

*Mr. Huntington*—On Friday next—ENQUIRY OF MINISTRY—Whether any negotiations are progressing regarding the proposed International Park at Niagara; and if so, what is the nature thereof?

*Mr. Gault*—On Friday next—ENQUIRY OF MINISTRY—Has the Government had any correspondence during the past twelve months with the Government of Newfoundland with a view of bringing that Island into Confederation with the Dominion?

*Mr. Landry*—On Friday next—ENQUIRY OF MINISTRY—Whether the Government can give to-day the answer promised on Monday last, the seventh of this present month, in reference to the action they intend to take upon the Petitions presented to them by the people of the Province of Quebec and by the Members of this House asking for the construction of a Branch Line of the Intercolonial Railway from St. Charles to St. Joseph de Lévis?

*Sir John A. Macdonald*—On Friday next—COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE to consider the following Resolutions:

1. That it is expedient to provide that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations:

(1) For ascertaining the quantities and values of fish plates and other fastenings, spikes, bolts, nuts, wire and iron bridges, manufactured in Canada and used by the Canadian Pacific Railway Company in the original construction of the Canadian Pacific Railway as defined in the Act 37 Victoria, Chapter 14, and also the quantities and values of all telegraphic apparatus manufactured in Canada and used by the said Company in the original construction and first equipment of a telegraph line in connection with the said Railway:—

And for ascertaining the persons in Canada from whom such fish plates and other fastenings, spikes, bolts, nuts, wire and iron bridges and telegraphic apparatus, respectively, have been procured by the said Company:

2. That the Governor in Council, with the assent of the Treasury Board, and on such terms and conditions as may be thought proper, may pay over to the persons in Canada from whom such articles as aforesaid, manufactured in Canada, have been procured, sums of money not exceeding the amount of Customs duty which would have been payable on such articles respectively, if imported into Canada at the time they were so procured by the said Company.
