fupporting arbitrary power in a province, now the largest and most populous belonging to, and dependent on, the imperial crown of these kingdoms.

The chief justice, as commissioner, opened the investigation in the beginning of June of the fame year, 1787, and three members of the legislative council, who are likewise judges in the Court of Appeals, were examined; viz. the Honourable William Grant, the Honourable Hugh Finlay, and the Honourable George Pownal, Esquires. Their evidence shews particularly the confusion that has prevailed in the court of which they are members; and the impossibility of finding confiftency in a court composed of fo many judges. They likewife speak to the inconfistency of the Courts of Common Pleas. They state, that English judges follow English law; French judges follow French law; and that fome of them follow no particular law, but decide according to what
