Militia General Orders.

1. HIS Honor the President, and Lieutenant General Commanding, has been pleased to direct, that all the Sedentary Militia, at present on duty, be forthwith dismissed, and permitted to return to their homes ; with the exception of those only, employed on a particular service, under the superintendance of Assistant Commissary General Crookshank, near York.

2. In future, when any portion of Militia, however small, is called out on the Public Service, a copy of the Orders, issued on the occasion, a return of the strength of the detachment, with a Nominal List of the Officers thereof, the Duty to be performed, the Station where to be employed, and the Probable Duration of the Service, are to be transmitted to the Adjutant General of Militia, at Head Quarters, for the Information of His Honor, the President.

3. These Returns, and Communications, are not only to be transmitted, by the officer commanding the Regiment, from whence the Drafts are made, but also, by the Officer in immediate command of the Detachment.

4. A Monthly Return will also be required, from Commanding Officers of Corps, on the 25th of each Month ; agreeable to a form which will be transmitted to them ; several copies of which will, in the first instance, be issued to each Commanding Officer.
