FERTILE SOIL

what kind of soil have you prepar-ed for your plants? I say "prepared," purposely. No matter how fertile ap-parently the soil is in your garden, that fertility should be tempered to the ial needs of the various plants un-

Let me explain. A fertile soil is one contains decomposing material in such proportion that sufficient hourishment for the plants growing in it
is constantly being manufactured.
And not only this; but, the nourishment being manufactured should not
be over abundant, otherwise rank

be over abundant, otherwise rank growth will be the result.

In preparing your soil, here are a few points to bear in mind: (a) The production of leaves, of flowers, of seed, of bulbs; (b) the nature of the subsoil; (c) the nature of the original soil itself; (d) situation, exposure.

Now taking the first point for discretion such plants whose foliage is

sion, such plants whose foliage is e than usually in request, in other more than usually in request, in other words, heavy (Nicotina, Dielytra, Mysostis); or, such plants as produce bulbous roots, but have a small expanse of leaves which fact renders them entirely dependent upon the soil for food; these two types can scarcely ever be overfed. 


