ALLIES UNDER GEN. FRENCH WIN DECISIVE VICTORY

GERMAN IMPERIAL GUARD COMMANDED BY THE CROWN PRINCE ANNIHILATED

LONDON, Sept. 7 .- (10.17 p,m.) -A Boulogne despatch to The Evening News says: "A telegram has been received from Gen. Pau, announcing a victory by the allied forces under Field Marshal Sir John French, commanding the British, and Gen. d'Amade at Precy-sur-Oise, about 25 miles north of Paris.

"The allies were drawn across the northern line with the centre at Precy. The English troops were on the left, and the French on the right. The former had in front of them the Imperial Guard, under Crown Prince Frederick William.

"On both wings, it is reported, the allies were successful. The German left was held by the French and retired to the north.

"THE IMPERIAL GUARD, WHO WERE ORDERED TO SURRENDER, WERE ANNIHILATED BY THE BRITISH. It is reported that the crown prince was in their midst."

The official bureau says: "Gen. Joffre's plans are being steadily carried out. The allied forces, acting on the offensive, have been successful in checking and forcing back in a northeast direction the German forces opposed to them."
