SIEGE of QUEBEC,

In 1759.

N the 26th of *June* Admiral Saunders errived, with the first division of the fleet and transports, near the middle of the isle of Orleans; as did the fecond and third divisions the next day, being the 27th, when Major-General Wolfe landed the troops under his command on the island of on, be which many anchors and small boats were lost, and much damage was done among the transports, by driving on board each other. General Wolfe having received a melfage from Admiral Saunders, that there was reason to think, that the enemy had artillery, and a force, upon the Point of Levi, the General detached Brigadier Monekton with four battalions to drive them from thence.

On the 28th, at midnight, the enemy fent down from *Quebec* feven firefhips; and though our fhips and transports were to numerous, and neceffarily fpread to great a part of the channel, we towed them all clear and a-ground, without receiving the least damage from them.
