expedition to the Chefapeak took place after wards; and fome unfortunate events in Carolina calling for still farther reinforcement and co-operation, foon reduced this part of my army to a defensive, almost as low in numbers as Sir William Howe left me in 1777. fuccesses, therefore, in the southern Provinces have not answered your Lordship's expectations, it cannot, I am certain, be imputed either to the smallness of the numbers I left there. or the tardiness or scantiness with which I have fince supplied the exigencies of that fervice. Though I am strongly impressed with the importance of recovering Virginia, I fear the entire reduction of fo populous a province is not to be expected from an operation folely there; unless our friends in it were more numerous, and were heartily inclined to affiff us not only in conquering, but in keeping it.
