TERRORISTS THROW BOMB AT GOLD-LADEN CARRIAGE

Robbers Get Away With 28,000 Rubles, But Drop Bag With Much More.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 28.—The revolutionary terrorists achieved Saturday in the heart of St. Petersburg an astounding victory over the government's protected treasury.

Along this route comes twice a week a carriage drawn by two horses and bringing notes from the printing house of the Imperial Bank for distribution by the treasury department.

London, Oct. 28.—Sir George Henry Lewis, acting solicitor for the Duke and Duchess of Marlborough, says he is authorized to state that no deed of separation between the duke and duchess has been signed, and that the children of the couple are not in the custody of the duchess.

The Duke of Marlborough and members of his family, including the Marquis of Blandford and Lord Spencer Churchill, the duke's son, are in the residence at Blenheim.

HAMILTON HAPPENINGS

CALL EVANGELIST TORREY THROUGH MINISTERS OBJECT

Pastor Bell Opposes "Mushroom Christianity." But Laity Favor Revival.

Hamilton, Oct. 28.—(Special.)—Evangelist Torrey has been invited to spend from three to four weeks here next January, but the invitation was not countenanced by the ministers of the city.

Only four or five ministers, although they all specially invited, attended the meeting and two of three of them opposed the invitation.

Rev. J. H. Bell, pastor of the Hannah-street Methodist Church, announced that he would refuse to vote because the matter had been before the ministerial association twice, and the ministers had agreed that a better man than Torrey could be brought to the city.

Rev. J. H. Triggerson advised the meeting to go slowly, because of the expense. C. G. Bookers spoke in opposition, declaring that he did not believe in "mushroom Christianity."

On motion of H. S. Brennan and F. C. Kelly, it was finally agreed by a vote of about 100 to 5 to telegraph Dr. Torrey an invitation, providing that a hall could be found, and means of raising the money provided.

Mr. Alexander will not accompany Dr. Torrey, but Mr. Butler will take his place.

CONDUCTORS ASK ENQUIRY WHY MANY WERE LET GO

Omissions in Ticket Collecting Said Now to Have Resulted in Wholesale Dismissals.

Montreal, Oct. 28.—(Special.)—The Grand Trunk conductor matter is in its final stage. One of the conductors said today:

"The whole affair was a complete surprise to me, and all the more so, because I can think of nothing that I have done that would justify my services without a moment's warning."

"I do not care to say much at present, but you may depend upon it that I will not allow the matter to drop. I understand that a reference is to be made to the executive of the International Order of Railway Conductors, and it is certain that this organization will probe the matter to the bottom."

"It was learned at Bonaventure Station that the reason for the dismissals could not have been the age of the conductors. True, many of them are well advanced in years, but a large proportion are in the prime of life."

"I was engaged in digging a drain on Czar-street on Saturday afternoon Harry Cousins, a civic employee, living at 70 Birch-avenue, received serious injuries by the caving in of the sides."

At the point where Cousins was engaged in digging the drain was some ten feet deep, and while none of the rest of the laborers received any injuries, Cousins was buried completely up to his eyes.

The ambulance conveyed the injured man to his home.
