KAISER'S DAZZLING SHOW SEEN BY FOREIGN ENVOYS

Reviews Guard Corps in Presence of Large Number of Delegations.

BERLIN, Sept. 2.—Emperor William this morning reviewed the guard corps garrisoning Berlin, on the Tempelhofer field.

The event was notable owing to the presence of a large number of foreign delegations as the guests of the emperor.

The special military representatives of Great Britain, the United States, Japan, Persia and Abyssinia, formed a prominent group among the members of the brilliant uniformed staff surrounding the saluting point.

The emperor displayed remarkable satisfaction at the bearing of the troops before the foreign officers.

After leading the march past his majesty's chatted good humoredly with his military guests.

Frederick William, who led a regiment of cuirassiers, was loudly cheered. Hundreds of thousands of people lined the streets to witness the emperor's passage from the castle to the Tempelhofer field and his return from the review.

BURGLAR SHOOTS SELF AFTER RACE FOR FREEDOM

Two Men Caught in Act of Robbing Store, Murder Vigilant Cop.

LINDHURST, N. J., Sept. 2.—George Cassidy, a policeman, was shot and killed to-day while endeavoring to arrest two burglars who had been caught in the act of robbing a store.

The burglars were pursued by a crowd, and rather than submit to capture, one of them killed himself in a swamp. The other burglar escaped.

Cassidy had arrested the men and started with his prisoners for the station house, when one of them whipped a revolver from his pocket and pressed it against Cassidy's coat, pulled the trigger.
