BLUE JACKETS ARE AT PEKIN

The British, United States, French, Italian and Japanese Legations Are Now Guarded

AND THE SITUATION IS IMPROVED.

The Chinese Capital is Greater, But the Boxers Are Still Active in the Country.

Shanghai, June 1.—The detachment of over 300 international blue jackets has arrived at Pekin.

The Situation Improved. Washington, June 1.—Minister Conger at Pekin reports to the State Department to-day that the arrival of 350 guards for the legations of Russia, France, Great Britain, Italy, Japan and the United States has had the effect of improving the situation.

Boxers Use Big Knives. Dr. Mary T. Burnham of the Presbyterian Mission at Chinanfu Tells of the Trouble.

Miss Burnham says: "The new Governor of Chinanfu has succeeded in quelling all outbreaks of the Boxers in the city. We cannot go from the city, however, without a guard, and much of the mission work is at a standstill.

Had Two Men Beheaded. The English consul, Mr. Campbell, is still here. He has had two men put to death for the murder of Mr. Brooks.

Governor Crippled by Subordinates. The new Governor is doing his duty, but is crippled by his subordinates. The head of the Board of Punishments has given Mr. Campbell, the English consul, much trouble.
