Funeral Will Take Place on Saturday at Noon in Canterbury Cathedral.

London, Dec. 23.-The Archbishop of Canterbury passed away quite peacefully at 8.15 o'clock in the presence of his wife and two sons. His leath was anticipated for some days, and only the Archbishop's remarkable vitality enabled him to counteract his extreme weakness. The final collapse occurred about 6 o'clock, and he was enscious towards the end. The rimate died of old age.
