Toronto had only one rival in Canada yesterday, and that was in Essex County, where the temperature was 94. It will be quite warm to-day, with a chance of scattered thunderstorms.

Going Back Some.

The highest temperature recorded in the 65 years' history of Toronto weather was on Aug. 24, 1854, when the Crimeant war was occupying Europe. Toronto tose to 99.2 degrees on that day. The average highest temperature in all these years is 91.3. The following figures are of interest as showing the heated periods which have occurred in the months of July in a number of years. 
