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WAGE SCHEDULES ONLY PROBLEM THAT REMAINS TO ADJUST

Federated Trades Are Awaiting Amendments Promised in McAdoo Awards.

The question of wages is practically the only one which the representatives of the federated shop crafts of the Canadian railroads and the Canada War Board have not agreed upon. Working conditions are settled and are satisfactory to the men. This is the report of one of the men who attended the meeting held at the McAdoo award. The federated unions who attended the meeting held at the McAdoo award, the local representative to the conference of the Canada War Board, attended the meeting and reported the progress that had been made during the time the meetings have been held.

No proposition has as yet been made by the men side of the McAdoo award, which has been granted the American railway workers. The men have all voted against accepting the award as it now stands, and also against waiting for the amendments which have been promised. The wage base on which the men want a settlement is as follows: Mechanic, 75 cents; specialized laborers, 62 1/2 cents; laborers, helpers, 50 cents per hour. At that rate all piece work would be cut out.

A number of men from the M.C.R. St. Thomas, were present at the meeting yesterday, and reported that while they are not satisfied with it. The local men are waiting for the amendments to be taken today is the general opinion.

DESERTED BECAUSE HE DID NOT WANT TO KILL RELATIVES

Alfred Klagen Has Relations Serving in the Kaiser's Army.

A court-martial, with Lieut.-Col. H. L. Milligan, 1st Battalion, Canadian Garrison Regiment, as president, was busily engaged Monday trying members of the 1st Division, who had been sent overseas for breaches of military regulations.

The first case to be tried was that of Pte. Alfred Klagen, who was charged with desertion from his unit. Pte. Klagen pleaded guilty, his excuse for the offence being the fact that his parents were German, and that if he were sent overseas he would be necessary for him to fight against relatives in the Hun army, which he was reluctant to do.

Pte. John Morrison, whose home is in Alliston, Ont., was charged with desertion from his unit, and pleaded guilty, claiming that his religious convictions prevented him from taking an active part in warfare. He quoted Scripture in defence of his stand, but it is rumored that the court did not find him so kind to his defence.

Another conscientious objector, Pte. Alfred Thompson, could not be satisfied in a non-combatant unit, as he informed the court that his religious principles would not allow him to mingle with anyone engaged in killing others.

Pte. Alvin M. Webster also pleaded guilty as a conscientious objector, but was not a member of any church or sect, following religious beliefs of his own. His parents wished him to serve, but Webster said they were not Christians. He informed the court that since his detention his mother had been stricken seriously with nervous prostration, and the illness was regarded as fatal by the doctor in attendance.

With those who pleaded guilty to the charges against them the court had no alternative but to convict, and for conscientious objectors the usual punishment is two years in civil prison. The sentences of the court will not be promulgated for a few days, and it is likely that the ten members tried yesterday will be sentenced before word of Western Ontario Regiment on parade in about one week's time.

STREET RAILWAY SERVICE

City Council Accepts Recommendation From No. 1 Committee.

Solicitor to Decide if City Can Collect Dollar Per Car.

The city council last night accepted the recommendation of No. 1 committee that the London Street Railway Company be ordered to restore the service provided by the city bylaw.

There was no discussion on the recommendation other than the statement of Ald. Moorhead that the service was inadequate.

There was quite a discussion and a motion was carried by a majority of 10 to 4 that the company be charged \$1 per car for all Springfield cars leaving the corner of Dundas and Richmond streets.

No. 1 committee, on the affirmative vote of Aldermen Ashplant and Wilson, decided to recommend to the council that the \$1 fee be charged. The board of control, on considering the committee's recommendation, decided to recommend to the council that the proposed amendment be submitted to the city solicitor for a ruling as to the legality of such a charge.

Ald. Ashplant thought that it was an unconstructive suggestion for a constructive motion. He thought that the council should pass the matter subject to the approval of the solicitor being obtained. He moved an amendment to this effect.

Sent to Committee.

Controlled by Ald. Moorhead, an amendment to the amendment that the matter be referred back to No. 1 committee, and they could get the opinion of the solicitor and report at the next meeting of the council.

A show of hands was called and the mayor declared the amendment to the amendment carried by 6 to 5. There were 13 present.

The council immediately proceeded to other business. A few minutes later, Controller Saunders said that he thought the council should call a meeting with the vote, and asked for the year and days. These were called, and it was found that the vote was 6 to 5 and the amendment to the amendment was declared lost. The amendment to the motion was then voted on and carried by 13 to 5. The board of control's action on the matter was then declared.

There was a short discussion on the matter outside the remarks of Ald. Ashplant. Ald. Watt, who supported the motion, said that he did not think that five cents was too high a fare to Springfield, but that all piece company's method. This modification of the bylaw was made at the request of Crowe, Attorney McKillop, acting for the restaurant owners, who said that they would be put to great expense if they had to tear up their floors.

The recommendation of No. 1 committee that the war tax on the property of soldiers be remitted was also brought up. Ald. Watt said that he had just been on a vacation at the time the tax was going to be levied, and that he had not been able to get it remitted.

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
