### **SIGNOR DI MARIA** HERE FOR FIRST DIOCESE VISIT

Apostolic Delegate To Canada Is Given a Warm Welcome.

BESTOW POPE'S BLESSING

Will Visit Chatham This Afternoon and Windsor On Wednesday.

His Excellency, Most Reverend Signor Peter De Maria, D.D., apostolic delegate to Canada, arrived in London Monday afternoon via the Grand Trunk on his first visit to this city. At the station he was received by the Marconi band, and welcomed by Bishop Fallon and Roman Catholic clergy of the city with prominent Catholic citizens. then conveyed by auto to the home of Bishop Fallon, where he donned his robes of office and headed by the Marconi band, proceeded to St. Peter's Parish hall via Talbot and Maple

At 6:30 p.m. a dinner was tendered the delegates by the clergy of the dio-cese, after which he proceeded to St. Peter's seminary. Here a procession was formed with St. Peter's seminarwas formed with St. Peter's seminarians leading, followed by the priests of the London diocese, a choir of 26 local altar boys singing under direction of Father Finn, Philip Pocock, Bishop Fallon and Signor De Maria, the concourse proceeding along Dufferin avenue to St. Peter's Cathedral between a bodyguard of several hundred local Roman Cathelia men and women, who knelt on tholic men and women, who knelt on the grass and sidewalks as his excel-lency passed along. The Roman Ca-tholic men then followed the procession into the cathedral. Altar boys bore the flowing robes of Bishop Fallon and Sig-nor De Maria.

Official Welcome.

In the church, on behalf of the Roman Catholic laity of the diocese, Bishop M. F. Failon tendered an official welcome to his excellency as representative of the Pope, and asked that he bestow upon all present the pontifical bless-

Signor De Maria, rising, thanked those present for the cordial welcome, after which he bestowed the pontifical blessing upon them. Although this reception was for men and boys only, many women were present both outside the cathedral and during the bestowal of the Pope's blessing. After the papal blessing the delegate gave the benedic-tion of the sacred sacrament. Following the reception in the

cathedral his excellency addressed local Italian Catholics in his native tongue in St. Peter's Parish Hall. At this meeting on behalf of the members of the Italian Benevolent Society Professor Venuta presented his excellency with a handsome silver box, the top representing the landing of Columbus. In the box were a set of beads.

Signor Di Maria remained over night at Bishop Fallon's house as his guest. at Bishop Fallon's house as his guest, and this morning at \$.30 o'clock celebrated low mass in St. Peter's Cathedral for women and children. In doing so he was assisted by Rev. Father L. M. Forristal, professor of liturgy at St. Peter's Seminary, and Rev. Father W. Langlois of Ford City. A feature of this service was the singing of hymns by \$00 local separate school children, under the direction of Rev. Father M. under the direction of Rev. Father M. A. Brisson. This ceremony was largely attended and very impressive throughout. At the conclusion of mass the children marched to school and his ex cellency was the guest of the profes-sors of St. Peter's Seminary for break-

On Thursday his excellency will at-tend the celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of Assumption College at Sandwich, when several bishop grad-uates of this institution will be present. In addition the Archbishop of Toronto will attend and Bishop M. Fallon will Then he will return to Ottawa. Bishop

Fallon will accompany him upon his Western Ontario tour, which is merely a visit of Signor Di Maria as diplomatic presentative of the Vatican for Canada, with headquarters at Ottawa.
