AGAINST ASIATICS

Geo. Anderson and J. A. Paterson Interest the Laurier Club.

The question of Asiatic or Oriental immigration, otherwise known as the Yellow Peril, was discussed last evening before the Laurier Club in Broadway Hall, by George Anderson, J. A. Paterson, K.C., and others.

"Our immigration policy is not as good as it might be," said Mr. Anderson. "We have been too anxious to get more numbers instead of quality."

The tendency in Canada and the United States has been to take up who are called the gentile occupations, and for the next 20 years we must probably depend on our navy work upon foreign labor. But if this rough labor is to be done by foreigners, we should seek to get those who will best assimilate with us, and we could assimilate much better with some of the northern European nations than with the Asiatics.

The oriental mind, it should be remembered, was very subtle and astute, and he hoped that Hon. Mr. Lemieux would not allow the Japanese to pull the wool over his eyes while in Tokio.

When in Japan 10 years ago, at the request of Sir Richard Cartwright, he had interviewed the government on this subject, and the present ambassador in London, England, then in the foreign office, told him that we considered the Japanese undesirable as a people, and in their government would secure its cessation. He hoped that Mr. Lemieux would be so fortunate as to secure as satisfactory an answer.

J. A. Paterson, K.C., said that although he might be said to be born equal, yet there were differences in the quality of things for Asiatics to come here in great numbers.

In a motion in favor of dropping the present riding association of the Conservatives was carried unanimously, and the election of officers was postponed until the next meeting, two weeks hence.

SIX MEN DROWNED.

Survivor Returns From Interior of British Columbia.

VANCOUVER, B. C., Dec. 2.—Upset in the boiling waters of one of the rapids of the Upper Fraser River, dashed over the falls against the knife-edged of protruding rocks until his tortured nerves "and falling strength almost made him resign himself to death, clinging all the while to a fellow-woodsman, whose arms were locked about him in his last clasp, were a few of the experiences of M. McLaughlin, a timber cruiser, just returned after a summer in the wilds of interior British Columbia.

That he is alive to tell the story, he considers a miracle; certainly as he unfolded his tale to-day it seemed so like some novel wonder as to be almost unbelievable. As it was six men were drowned.

McLaughlin and his partner, John Evans, were the only survivors out of a party of seven white men and one Indian. The names of all those lost are not known to Mr. McLaughlin. They were all employed by the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Co. in survey work, and were on their way west at the time of the catastrophe.
