LIVE STOCK MARKET

The run of cattle and live stock of all kinds on the Union Stock Yards yesterday was almost unprecedentedly heavy and even at this season of the year, 245 cars in all, comprising mone than 4000 head of cattle, 630 hogs, nearly 1000 sheep and lambs, and 208 calves. The heavy deliveries, coupled with the extreme heat, had a depressing influence on the market in the early hours of the day, and it was well on to noon before buying was well under way, and when it did there was a notable decline in prices for practically all lines of cattle from 35c to 50c per cwt., and in some cases a clean cut of 75c per cwt.

The decline was most marked in butcher cattle, but all lines shared in the lowering tendency. There was a big run of good useful cattle on the market, but a marked absence of extra choice heavy butchers, and in a few cases fancy prices were recorded.

To just what extent the stockers and feeders suffered in the decline it would be difficuit to say, but the general opinion was that the lower rate was about equally applicable to all grades. There vore many cases where cattle sold yesterday at from \$10 to \$10.25, which last Thursday would have readily commanded \$10.75.
