CHEERED AS THEY START OUT FOR THAT \$50,000

Encouraging Reception at Workers in Fitting Out For Office Work

The manner in which the public are receiving the endeavor to increase the Patriotic Fund by \$50,000 is well shown by the heartiness in the reception accorded committees which set to work canvassing for donations yesterday. It was most encouraging, and greatly appreciated by those in charge. After all the appeals which have been made, now comes the most elaborate and stupendous of all—the patriotic auction to secure \$50,000 in a week, and the merchants and general body of citizens are found rising once again to the occasion and lending an active hand.

The initial endeavor of the committees has been to secure material for office-work. The temporary offices will be opened on next Tuesday at 181 Prince William street. This means a big supply of stationery, for there will be much writing necessary, and the generosity of local printing houses was appealed to with most successful results. From Roger Hunter, Ltd., a donation of 30,000 tags was received; C. M. Lingard, 10,000 shipping tags; Geo. A. Knodel, 10,000 cardboard tags; Fred Dolis, 800 envelopes and 500 letter-heads; United Typewriter Co., packages of carbon paper; and F. C. Wesley & Co., a cut containing the I. O. D. E. badge to be placed upon the stationery. The tags mentioned are all of different kinds to be used for different purposes, and with the other gifts are a gratifying stimulus to the first stages of the campaign.

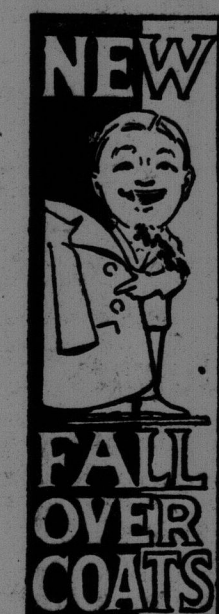

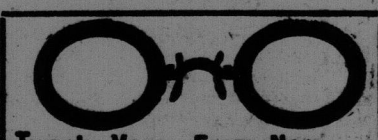

Any material falling in weight from their table of normal weight statistics is in itself sufficient to cause them, in most cases, to regard the applicant as an "undesirable risk." The following table of normal weights enables both men and women to know exactly what they should weigh to conform to the average for various heights:
