## MAY BUILD ON TO HOME OF INCURABLES

Subscribers Told That Increased Accommodation is Needed.

Institution Founded by W. W. Turnbull is 23 Years Old—Patients 30 at Beginning of July—Financial Report Shows Funds on Hand to the Amount of \$155,483.40.

The annual meeting of the subscribers to the St. John Home for Incapables is being held this afternoon with J. S. Gregory, the president, in the chair. The reports of the various departments were presented.

**President's Report.**  
The report of the president and Board of Directors was read by Mr. Gregory as follows:—  
Throughout the year your board has faithfully carried on the work of the Home. The degree of prosperity that has attended this institution since it was founded by the late W. W. Turnbull in 1900 gives cause for deep thankfulness and reflects credit upon those splendid men and women who by service have brought this useful work to its present high standard and also reflects credit upon generous donations of various useful articles and sympathy. A continuance of this latter practical charity is looked for and will be most acceptable.

On July 1, 1922, there were thirty patients in the Home, fifteen men and fifteen women, July 1, 1923, there were thirty-one patients in the Home, fifteen men and sixteen women. During the year twenty-one applications for admission have been considered by the Board.

We cannot close without mention of the great loss that has come to the board by the death of our esteemed and valued co-worker Mrs. Richard O'Brien. The wisdom and ability which Mrs. O'Brien exercised in aid of our board work by counsel and service will be held in grateful remembrance.

Requests received during the year to the total of \$2,949.88. The sum of \$2,000.00 was received from the H. Malina Fowler estate, \$800 from the J. A. Tilton estate, \$800 from the Ada B. Hamilton estate and \$100 from the Grace Murphy estate. Now invested in interest bearing securities these welcome additions to our funds will substantially augment that account which for the year reached the total of \$7,779.08. Exchanges of bonds added \$350 to our capital in addition to the \$207.88 secured in the same way in the previous year, while our interest revenue and our revenue from the maintenance of the Home during the year. 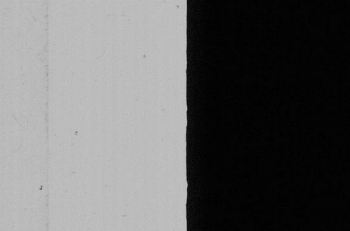
