FOR TWENTY-SEVEN YEARS SERVED AS SUPERINTENDENT

After holding the office of superintendent of the Sunday School of Portland Methodist church for twenty-seven years, R. T. Hayes, M. P. F., declined reelection at the annual meeting held last night and was made honorary superintendent.

S. A. Kirk, the former associate superintendent, was appointed to succeed him. A. W. McInnes had served as treasurer for twenty years and Mrs. McInnes had been a teacher of the school for several years. As Mr. Hayes' resignation was accepted, the school officers were leaving shortly to make their home in Moncton, a presentation was made to them by the school and the best wishes extended to them by Mr. Hayes. T., Miss Lillian Bloomfield; Trail Rangers, Herbert Naves. The reports showed the school to be in a very flourishing condition.
