The stock market, Sept. 29. During the last week investment conditions have shown very little change and the demand still continues for prime issues with high yield. About ten days ago an offering of \$10,000,000 equipment notes was snapped up readily, as the yield was 5.25 per cent. The bankers reporting the season's issues of four per cent. railroad bonds; the strength, for instance, in Baltimore & Ohio 4s has been especially noticeable, as these bonds have advanced over four points since an offering of a large amount was made two months ago. Conditions, however, have not reached the stage yet where new issues of prime, high yielding railroad bonds can be floated readily.
