Geneva, March 27.—(United Press)

—The League of Nations is definitely decided that 1924 shall pass down in history as "disarmament year."

After nearly four years of study and preparation of the question, including consultation with the half hundred states that are members of the league, the latter is convinced that it has now reduced to a definite and concrete basis all that can be done in the matter of reduction of armaments at the present time.

These possibilities will during the course of the coming summer be whipped into shape in the form of international treaties for submission to the fourth general assembly of the league in September.

Once the league's assembly has pronounced the final work on these treaties, all members of the league, as well be asked to sign them.


