

SAINT JOHN MEN CUP WINNERS AT SUSSEX SHOOT

Prince of Wales Match Is
Won by Q. M. S. McLaughlin

SUSSEX, Aug. 5.—The marksmen at the range had a busy day today. In addition to the Dominion Cup, the following matches were completed: Officers' match at 200 and 600 yards, the Cadet individual and team matches, 200 and 600 yard ranges of the Association teams, and the final stage of the Prince of Wales, consisting of 10 shots at 900 yards. Almost ideal shooting conditions existed and the scoring, especially at the 900 yard range, was particularly high. Three competitors, Sgt. A. S. Emery, Lt. J. T. Downey and Cadet S. M. F. C. DeVenne, all of Saint John, made 49 points out of the possible 50.

Returns of the Prince of Wales match have not yet been fully completed, but first place has been won by Company Q. M. Sgt. H. R. McLaughlin, Saint John Fusiliers, with a score of 118 points out of a possible 120.

MUSSOLINI BANS USELESS RITES

Government Seeks Control of
Sporting and Automobile
Associations

ROME, Aug. 6.—Premier Mussolini's plans to direct the entire mental, spiritual and physical life of the Italian people into Fascist channels took a long step forward through the adoption of a decree providing for the gradual elimination of all non-Fascist public manifestations of an intellectual, sporting or charitable character.

To decree, which was adopted by the Cabinet on the direction of the Premier, also calls for the elimination of all ceremonies of commemoration and expressing honors for individuals. The measure calls for "hinderings" by means of official steps, all such public manifestations which are not "within the orbit of the directive tendencies of the government."

All officially approved manifestations and ceremonies are to be limited to those "effectively useful and which, through the high character of the organizers and the availability of funds, gives guarantees of attaining the purposes for which they are intended."

TO CONTROL SPORTS

One of the foremosters of the decree has been a far reaching reorganization of various sporting associations, notably the Automobile Club of Italy, the National Pugilistic Federation and the Italian Football Federation. This reorganization is intended to remove disturbing elements and to put the direction of the sports in the hands of the Fascist party.

The Cabinet also increased its already long list of measures to achieve economies in the government through cutting down on the number of state employees.

Another Cabinet measure provides for the issuance of nickel five-piece stamps with the Fascist emblem, replacing paper notes. The ministers also advanced to large shipowners a subsidy to pay an installment on vessels bought in England immediately after the war.
