The Evening School, as organized under the charge of Mr. Rollo, Head Master of the Louisa Street School, and Mr. Coyne, Head Master of the Phœbe Street School, was re-opened after the Christmas holidays, on Monday, the 9th of January, and was closed on Friday, the 15th of March.
