

Cross-examined by the Defending Officer.

Q. This shirt, cotton khaki on "Exhibit G". Shirts, cotton, khaki, WSS, two pairs, value 88¢.

A. Yes, sir, that is explained by the price change since that time.

Q. Well were they ever down as low as 44¢?

A. No, I don't remember 44¢.

Q. Yes - that would be 44¢ - that would be 75% of the value of the shirt at that time according to this.

A. No, I don't ever remember it being that low.

The Prosecutor declines to re-examine.

Questioned by the Court:

Q. Would you look at this "Exhibit G" and this amount as shown for the shirts. What is your opinion as to that amount?

A. Shirts, khaki, cotton WSS - that is with short sleeves - two pairs. Shirts don't come in pairs, they come singly. The price of akhaki cotton shirt at that time was .99¢. That is the full vocabulary rate. Ninety and some odd cents.

Q. Do you think it is an error in the description of the article or in the description of the amount?

A. It could be a description - an error in the description of the amount. Shirts khaki cotton are all classed as shirts khaki cotton whether or not they have long or short sleeves.

The witness withdraws.
