New York .- The long continued ontroversy in the garment trades industry reached a new crisis when 0,000 workers, members of three unon locals left their machines in obedence to an order from their commi

The firms affected by the order reesented the bulk of the women's garment industry in this city. Originally the controversy centred around locals numbers 2, 9, and 22, but reently it has been extended by complaints that some employers were taking advantage of the discord within the union to reduce wages.

Thirteen separate meetings were scheduled by the workers to be held after the stoppage order went into effect. Police reserves patrolled the vicinity of Union Square as a precaution against disorder at these assemblies.

The walkout was described by un on officials as a "demonstration, the program calling for the return of all members to their positions to morrow. One of the questions to be discussed at the various meetings, however is whether the demonstra tion shall be made the inauguration of a general strike.
