REPORT OF THE GRAND KEEPER OF RECORDS AND SEAL.

To the Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge:

I beg to submit for your consideration the nineteenth annual report of this office for the year ending May 31st, 1891.

STATE OF THE ORDER.

By reference to the numerical and financial statements, it will be seen that some progress was made during the year 1890. An increase of sixteen per cent. in membership, and eleven per cent. in receipts, with a decrease of five per cent. in expenses, notwithstanding an increase of over fifty per cent. of relief expenditure, is, to say the least, fairly gratifying and encouraging.

Minerva Lodge, No. 7, is still dormant, but Bro. Past Chancellor Eddis, late of Inglewood Lodge, No. 29, who is now living in Orillia, has hopes of being able to bring it into active existence again.

Native Valley Lodge, No. 27, I am afraid will not be able to survive the loss sustained through the death of its organizer, Bro. Bradley. While he was alive his magnetic influence drew the members, although widely scattered, regularly together, and an interest in the Order was sustained, but he being called away combined with other deaths and removals, seems to have completely disheartened the members, and a surrender of the charter is under consideration.
