NEARING PORT ARTHUR. OKIO, May 27-10 a. m.—After five days of desperate fighting the Japanese captured Kin Chou yesterday evening. Nan Quan Ling, a stronghold of the Russians, has fallen into the hands of the Japanese. An artillery duel still continues. The Russian gunboats bombarded the Japanese landing force from Taiten Wan Bay, while the Japanese warships worked with the army from Kinchou Bay.

FOOD SCARCE IN PORT ARTHUR. NEW CHWANG, May 27.—The Japanese estimate the strength of the Russian garrison at Port Arthur at twenty thousand men at Kin Chou.

GOLD SEEKERS STARVING. Miners in the Klondyke Have \$2,000,000 in Gold, But Have to Eat Dog Meat.

TACOMA, May 27.—Miners on Tanana River and its tributaries have taken to horse and dog meats while waiting the arrival of supplies. Staples have been very short all winter on the Tanana all winter. Early in May flour was \$40 per hundred and oats 25 cents a pound at Fairbanks.

CONSUMPTION CONGRESS OPENED. COPENHAGEN, May 27.—The International Tuberculosis Congress was formally opened in Parliament House this morning, under the presidency of Prof. Bronnfeldt, of Paris.

Russians Report that 1,500 of the Enemy Were Killed - Japs Nearing Port Arthur.

strengthened. A Russian correspondent of the Associated Press at Liao Yang last night mentioned the existence of the Russian headquarters there of the belief that there has been a change in the army's plan. General Kuraki is bringing up heavy supplies and guns to his position at Feng Wang Cheng.

ARTILLERY BEAR THE BRUNT. LONDON, May 27.—A despatch from Tokio to the Central News dated today, says: "The fighting which culminated in the Japanese occupation of Kin Chou was practically confined to an artillery duel, which, beginning at dawn of May 26, continued without intermission for 24 hours. Three Japanese warships in Kin Chou Bay co-operated. A Russian gunboat in Taiten Wan Bay also joined in the fight, bombarding the left flank of the Japanese army."

HEAVY JAP LOSS REPORTED. ST. PETERSBURG, May 27.—St. Petersburg is filled with all sorts of rumors regarding fighting, which the general staff has for three days been convinced is in progress on the lower part of the Liao Tung peninsula, but nothing official has been received. For instance, a story is going the rounds that General Fock (who was in command of the Russian advanced position at Kin Chou) got between two of the enemy's columns, inflicting heavy loss on them, but that the news is being held from announcement until today, the anniversary of Emperor Nicholas' coronation.

NEW YORK, May 26.—Chas. Lester Murphy, a barefoot country lad was committed to the county jail at Newark, N. J., today in default of \$1,000 bail, on a charge of swindling. When arraigned before U. S. Commissioner Whitehead, Murphy admitted that he had purchased a mail order list from a firm that furnishes addresses of persons living in rural districts and that he had written to many of those on the list asking if they did not wish to purchase stock that would yield a profit in the interest of 50 per cent.
