

## MOVES CHANGE IN THE PRESENT PAVING BILL

**Com. Agar Wants Law  
Made Clearer—To Define  
"Owners of Abutting  
Property."**

At the council meeting yesterday Com. Agar moved the adoption of a bill providing that the word "owner" be defined in the old ordinance as meaning the person or persons owning the property, and making the bill more specific in defining the circumstances under which paving work could be done. Also defining the term owner of abutting property, and making the bill more constructive so as to set at rest the doubts raised by the recorder. The motion was adopted.

Agar will bring out which will be submitted to the legislature will have the effect of making it impossible for a third of the property holders on a street to prevent the work of paving being done, case fifty per cent. of the abutters have petitioned for it. No change in the provisions for work insisted by the city is contemplated and it will still be possible for a third of the property holders to prevent the city from undertaking the paving of any street under the local ordinance. Another section of the bill provides that all assessments, agreements and paving work done under the act are confirmed, and that no person can be the petitioner of the expression of the property owner," which applies to the holder of fees simple, life estates and co-tenants.
