NEW SURGICAL INSTRUMENT Photographs Heart Beats and Diag-

It is understood that the visit here this week of W. Y. Williams, the well known mining engineer now of Spokane, was to look over the Queen Victoria mine at Beasley Siding to the Photographs Heart Beats and Diagnoses Disease.

PARIS, Oct. 23—Paris medical circles are much interested in the invention of the Dutch physiologist, M. Einthovien, who has constructed an apparatus which enables heart pulsations to be photographed.

This delicate instrument, the sensibility of which is finer than the human ear, is an ingenious combination of the stethoscope, microphone, phonograph and galvanometer. When auscultation is performed by Dr. Einthovein's invention, a photographic record of the oscillation of a sheet of aluminium shows the nature of the heart beats. Photographs of normal heart beats are very different from those of diseased organs. An experienced operator would be able to tell by examining the photographic tracings not only whether the heart was on their behalf that Mr. Williams made his inspection, being accompanied by J. A. Levisohn and S. S. Rosenstamm of New York, two of the interested parties. Mr. Williams would not give out any information for publication as to the result of his inspection but it is stated that his report will be wholly satisfactory to the bondholders.
