

dealt with but to guard against any further proceeding of a like nature, Mr Galt was requested in Departmental letter of 23rd December 1881, to inform Mr McDonald on no account to expend annuity money for any other purpose than the payment of annuities.

Even if Mr Galt did not convey the purport of this last clause, he had already warned Mr McDonald of the irregularity of his action; and as Mr Dougall was answerable to Mr McDonald for his conduct, Mr McDonald should have given such instructions as would have prevented the occurrence, and thus saved a great deal of trouble. If Mr Dougall paid these bachelors contrary to orders he is the more
