

young men and women, and if any of such are unable to work the cause of their inability to do so should be stated. The number of Indians in the County is, by latest advices, 38 souls.

2nd. There is a Reserve of a thousand acres at the Forks of the River Clyde or Cape Negro River, but it is not thought that there are any Indians resident upon it. You should visit, inspect, and report on this tract, as to the quality of the land and timber, also if any parties on it, by what authority they are there, and, if they have made improvements, of what they consist.

3rd. The prevention of the use of intoxicants by and the prosecution of any parties giving or selling them to the Indians should receive earnest attention at your hands.

4th. The sum of \$29.26 will be sent you about the Month of November, and \$24.32 in the Month of April of each year; the former amount you will use in the relief of any sick and aged Indians who are unable to procure the necessaries of life for themselves, and the latter sum you will expend in supplying seed grain or roots to such Indians as engage in cultivating lands; the seed given them should be proportionate to the quantity
