Sir,-

I beg to confirm the following telegram sent you on the 5th instant, in reply to yours of the 6th, viz:-

"May employ John One Spot to fill Stockman Grant's place temporarily".

As stated this appointment is temporary and the permanent appointment of One Spot will depend on the manner in which he will discharge his duties. His remuneration will be the same as was allowed him while he was employed in the capacity of Stockman and Farmer, prior to his resignation in 1913, namely, \$50.00 per month.

Kindly advise Department at once if John One Spot accepts the appointment on these terms, in order that steps may be taken to fill the vacancy of Assistant Stockman on the Blackfoot Reserve. (Department's letter 30th June, 1915 File No. 427,053-4.)
