the Ukrainian. Pelish and Byele-Russian delegates, while the Danish, Dutch, American, Belgian, French and other delegates supported the U.K. stand. The Canadian representative, Mr. Knewles, made a speech summarizing the two schools of thought, indicating that the Yegeslav Delegate was appreaching the problem from a purely political point of view and suggesting that it was after all primarily a humanitarian problem. Towards the end of the debate, the U.S.S.T. Delegation proposed a compromise measure which suggested the creation of a specialised agency on refugeos, the cossation in the refugee camps of all prepaganda against any one ubited nation, er any of its members, assistance in repatriation, and assistance to these presens not desireus of returning to the country of origin to settle in their country of residence with the consent of the country of origin. Mrs. Ressevelt, the American Delegate, then prepesed a further comprenise solution. the essence of which was that no uprocted persons should be compelled to return to their country of origin though they should be encouraged to do se, and that me action as a result of the resolution whould be of such a character as to interfere in any way with the surrender and punishment of war criminals. The question was then referred to a sub-committee which preduced a majerity report.

The argument between the Seviet group and the other countries may be summarised as fellows:

- (1) Whe is to determine whether a displaced person is a bena fide refugee or not, the proposed international agency or the country of origin.
 - (2) Sould prepagands among refugees against repatriation and against members of the United Nations be permitted.
 - (3) Should the personnel of the international organization on refugees be largely drawn from the countries of origin.

The report of the sub-committee was a fair compromise, admitting that war criminals should not receive any of the benefits of genuine right refugees, but standing firmly by the principles of the/asylum and humanity. The Seviet Delegation presented a series of amendments which were voted down. The easy real concession which received approval was a
