Good St. Anne Saves a Traveller from Inevitable Death

(Towards 1790)

The following narration was written by a priest who heard the details of this wonderful story from the very lips of the favored traveller.

In 1847, during the first years of my priesthood, I witnessed a scene which impressed me so deeply that I can never forget it. On a beautiful evening of July, I was summoned, in haste, to the assistance of an old man of eighty years of age.
