



A FEW years ago any one daring to predict that a typewriter could be operated at a speed of 100 words a minute would be laughed at. Yet the other day in *one* contest *five* Underwood operators wrote over 105 words a minute *net* for one hour. "Net" means after deducting five words for every error, however slight.

A LL speed records have been made on the Underwood. Just what the Underwood has done in raising the standard of typewriting generally is indicated by the following :—

At a typewriting contest held in San Francisco in 1896, (when the Underwood was making) the result in a *five-minute* test, according to present methods of rating, was a speed of 36 words a minute.

TO-DAY the record stands at 112 words a minute *net* for *one hour's continuous* writing. All such records have been made on the Underwood—only these can make them.
