



No. 1—Netherhall Goodtime, first prize senior Ayrshire bull at Ottawa, 1910; winner of 16 first prizes in Canada and the United States, including the National Dairy Show, Chicago, the Toronto and Ottawa, Ont., and Sherbrooke, Que., exhibitions. No. 2—Ardene, of Sunnyside, 1st prize yearling heifer at Ottawa. Both animals owned by John W. Logan, Sunnyside Stock Farm, Howick Station, Que. The three females are here cows shown by Alex. Home, of Menie, Ont. The flies were bothering them when the photograph was taken, with the result that the photograph does not do them justice. On the left is Scotia's Bull, first prize cow in the dry class at the Ottawa exhibition. The cow in the center is Princess Kina, the first prize Canadian dry cow at Ottawa.
