A PLOT THAT FAILED

Acts 23:14-24. Study Acts, ch. 23. *Scripture Memory Verse, Luke 2:7. Golden Cert-They shall fight against thee ; but they shall not prevail against thee :

24 And provide them beasts, that they may set Paul on, and bring him safe unto Fe'lix the governor.

THE LESSON RETOLD

In our story of two weeks ago, we saw how Paul was attacked by a crowd of Jews in the temple court, and was rescued by some Roman soldiers who put him in prison. Now, the captain of these soldiers wished to know which was in the right,-Paul or the Jews. So the members of the great council of the Jews were called together and Paul was brought from prison to meet them. Now, some of them were Pharisees and some were Sadducees. The Phansees believed that people who died would rise again, and the Sadducees did not believe this.

Paul, in speaking to the council, told them that he was a Pharisee and believed that the dead would rise again. The Pharisees began to take his part. They said they did not think Paul was doing anybody any harm, and, if he had a message from God, he should be allowed to go on telling it. This made the Sadducees very angry, and they began to quarrel with the Pharisees. Both parties grew angrier and angrier till at last there was such a noise and uproar that the captain was afraid they would pull Paul to pieces, and so he hurried some soldiers down to bring Paul back again into the prison for safety.

The same night, as Paul lay asleep, Jesus appeared to him and said : "Be of good cheer, Paul, you have spoken for me in Jerusalem, you shall also speak for me at Rome." Then Paul knew that Jesus would take care of him till his work was done.

Of course the Jews were very angry when the captain took Paul away from the council. Next day, forty of them banded themselves together, and each promised that he would neither eat nor drink till they had
