fame, as it shall appear to them, to the House; and that they have power to send for persons and papers.

ORDERED, That Mr. Chaboillez, Mr. Roy Portelance, Mr. M'Gill, Mr. Berthelot and Mr. Mondelet, do compose the said Committee.

The order of the day for taking into confideration the petition of fundry Electors of the County of York, against the election and return of E. L. Dumont, fils, and John Mure, Esquires, as Representatives of the said County, being read—

The faid petition was read by the Clerk, and the House proceeded to take the same into consideration.

Mr. Planté moved to resolve, seconded by Mr. Bourdages,

That the said petition contains matter sufficient for the House to proceed upon.

Mr. James Cuthbert moved in amendment, seconded by Mr. Fro-bisher.

That all the words after the word "petition" be left out, and the following substituted in their place, "without date of time or place, be dismissed."
